
Why is IAF CertSearch important?

In our globalised and digitised world, businesses and governments are demanding greater transparency across organizations and supply chains.

Accredited certification has made it possible for businesses and governments to develop compliant supply chains, however their ability to validate certifications has been restricted, due to the lack of a global integrated digital solution for validation of accredited certification. This has allowed fraudulent and fake certificates to persist and the misuse of accredited certification, undermining its value.

For the first time IAF CertSearch has made it possible to have representation connection of the entire accredited network




What is the result of market research?

Total participants: 10,616


Do you see value in a centralised global database of accredited certification?

This diagram shows certificates for a an organisation with multiple subsidiaries and multiple operational sites.


It is not practical for large corporations to verify certifications manually today!



Perpetual and real time monitoring

Compliance, procurement and governance teams can take action in real time.

Via a "watchlist" QT automatically informs organizations when certification body auditors have identified non compliance relating to certifications i.e. suspended, withdrawn, expired. This enables organisations be proactive and mitigate risk.





Database features for Certification Bodies

- CB Analytics which is analytics specific to your certification body - including aggregated analytics on certified entities, certifications, certified sites, verification activity. Filters and benchmarks.
- + Global Analytics anonymised aggregated analytics for all standards, sectors and locations (regional, country, state)
- + Benchmarks the ability to compare your "CB Analytics" to global benchmarks, such as : Standard, location, sector

Environmental Protection

At the end of 2021, 93% of our company-owned sites had achieved ISO 14001 certification, up from 79% in 2020.



3M's ISO 14001-certified sites account for is 77.4% of transfer value of shipments (TVOS) Third-party assurance of sustainability metric reporting.



All DuPont manufacturing sites in the US that meet the definition of a "Chemical Manufacturing Facility" as defined by the ACC must conform to and are audited against the RCMS standard. We set a goal to certify all global manufacturing sites to ISO 14001 by 2025 and to require all sites to conform to the RC14001 management system by 2030. Most DuPont sites are currently certified and new sites acquired through mergers and acquisitions where DuPont has a controlling interest will also be required to meet these standards. Conformance to these standards is confirmed using DuPont and third-party auditor assessments.



Countries are forcing organizations to disclose supply chain due diligence practices and take responsibility



March 2021 - The Human Rights Due Diligence Directive was presented to the Commision by the EU Parliament. The directive commands that companies take responsibility for their supply chains and take actions in order to ensure human rights and decrease environmental damage.
